

# FROM THE LEAD PASTOR

# **Give Today**

As we begin a New Year it's always good to evaluate our previous year. As a church the people of Holy Cross have served and blessed our community time and time again. In our condensed annual report we won't have a chance to highlight all the amazing things that God's people have done through the body of Christ at Holy Cross, but you will certainly get an amazing taste of it. From Ruby's Pantry to Care Portal to the Dorothy Day House and MN Adult & Teen Challenge, the India mission of Suresh, the Native American school supply outreach through VBS, the God Loves You Tour, and Care Portal Christmas. It has truly been an amazing year that has seen service, effort, and blessing for those outside of our walls. When we evaluated our ministry plan two years ago and determined that we wanted to be a church that focused on others outside our walls, it would've been



impossible to imagine the blessing of the Lord's work that has been accomplished in the past year.

For last year's ministry plan we determined that we had started some very impactful and meaningful new outreaches with Ruby's Pantry and Care Portal the previous year and that we should turn our attention to internal discipleship to provide for the growth of our members and community. We prayed about how to accomplish that, and regular small groups were implemented, starting with the Chosen Series. Ernie Freudenburg joined our staff as the Connecting Coordinator, and Diane Straka joined us as the Technology Coordinator. We dreamed about starting a children's discipleship program, which materialized into Kids 4 Truth; we asked God to provide us with a Pastor of Discipleship to lead our new and important emphasis, and Pastor Jordan Schut answered the call. All the while we continued our vital core ministries during Connecting Hour and beyond.

This year we have asked the Lord to help us with the emphasis of stewardship. When we restructured the leadership team and reworked our Constitution after our merger with Family of Christ, we decided that the church would be led by three primary teams – Outreach, Discipleship, and Stewardship. For the past two years we have seen God move in miraculous ways as we asked Him to lead and provide in these areas, and I expect nothing less in the coming year. Although I believe it may not be as glamorous of an emphasis as the other two, it is the third leg of our stool that we surely need to accomplish all that God has in store for us as a family of Christ here at Holy Cross.

As we begin this New Year, I ask that you would celebrate with me all that you have helped materialize through the people of Holy Cross over the past year and pray about how God might use you to aid in this new emphasis. The time to give is now. Stewardship requires the faith to give in the now without knowing about the later. That is why it takes faith to accomplish it and why Jesus regularly taught parables about stewardship, because we never know when the King is watching, and we never know when He will return. Ruby's Pantry has been in full swing now for 16 months.

During those 16 months we've learned a few things, made a few adjustments, and braved some rain and snow. But more importantly, during those 16 months we allowed God to work through us while we fed families, helped organizations, shared smiles, prayed with and over our guests, and watched God do miracles.

Month after month, you as a congregation have showed up and provided the 60+ volunteers required for the distribution. As a result of your faithfulness—God showed up. We have numerous messages and social media posts from families who have been blessed by Ruby's pantry. For our one-year anniversary, we were able to bless two families with Hy-Vee gift cards, and we blessed one additional family with a free share of food. Our prayer team gets prayer requests each month and gets to hear how God is answering prayers and moving in the hearts and lives of our quests. Our volunteers hear repeated "thank you's" as cars move down our distribution line.



Throughout the year we have seen a steady increase in the number of people served and the number of shares distributed. As grocery prices increased, so did our number of shares distributed, and we finished the year with a record

Any leftover food that is not distributed has been shared with many other organizations across the Rochester area.

# **CarePortal**

There will never cease to be poor in the land. Therefore, I command you to open wide your hand to your brother, to the needy, and to the poor.

Holy Cross shares the love of Christ by serving and blessing families in need through our CarePortal Ministry. In 2022 we responded to 117 requests from Olmsted County Social Services and Next Chapter Ministries (up 125% from 2021), serving 295 children (up 173% from 2021). These numbers include some double counts – when we served the same family multiple times – yet each request is unique and requires a team of people to help fulfill. We invested \$27,582 (up 78% from 2021) – which came from the following resources: \$16,864 came from individual donations to our CarePortal Fund (including some left over from 2021), \$4,354 came from funds we received through Ruby's



Pantry, \$3,864 came from proceeds of our Fruits of the Spirit garden sales, and \$2,500 came from a People's Cooperative Operation Round Up grant. We also coordinated numerous pickups and deliveries of donated furniture that are not included in these financials. Praise God for enabling us to serve in such generous ways!!

We blessed our CarePortal families with couches, tables, chairs, lamps, TVs, vacuums, beds, dressers, coats, boots, gloves, clothing, diapers, wash cloths & towels, pots & pans, cleaning supplies, security cameras, printers, car seats, strollers, wagons, bikes, lawn mower, gift cards, and food. We also helped some families with car repairs, carpet cleaning, rent, legal fees, and heating fuel. In December we hosted our first "CarePortal Christmas" and invited all the families we had served in 2022. We provided a meal, worship, and gifts for all the children. In total, 76 children



received Christmas gifts from us, and every family felt welcome and blessed.




# **Finances**



Holy Cross was richly blessed with financial resources in 2022. We received \$584,997 in General Fund gifts and spent \$572,454 for a \$12,543 surplus. Below is a multiyear look at the giving versus expense trends.







As Holy Cross moves into 2023 we have increased staff for our ministry and also have faced 2022 inflation in facility and program expenses. Holy Cross has budgeted \$632,224 in expenses. This will require about a 5.9 % increase in gifts. We are confident that God will provide but ask members to consider their commitment to a portion of ministry support. In 2021 and 2022 we launched exciting new outreach ministries, and we filled our vacant Associate Pastor position.

Members can do a few things. We ask you to generously support the General Fund, for without the staff and facility very little ministry happens. Our staff along with key volunteer leaders also marshal the outreach through Care Portal, Ruby's Pantry, and support of Brother Suresh's mission outreach in India. If you are inclined and able to make designated offerings, we ask you to focus them on these and the building fund. While many other worthwhile options exist, Holy Cross wants to ensure solid 2023 support for our key ministry areas.


In the winter of 2022, we gathered to worship God both Saturday evening and Sunday morning with Sunday services also being available online. Weekly average worship attendance continued to recover from the COVID-19 pandemic, increasing in 2022 from 109 to 120 individuals (see Table and Graph below).

During 2022, Holy Cross received 11 individuals as new members, while 2 individuals had their membership transferred to another church, and 9 individuals transferred to churches outside of Rochester. Five individuals were baptized at Holy Cross.

draws their interest in learning more ~ because we are humbly devoted to one another in love, joyful in hope, sharing with those in need, practicing hospitality.


