JOINING JESUS CONTINUED

JESUS DOESN'T CHANGE

As we enter into springtime and the fluctuating weather and temperatures, I am reminded that Jesus is the same yesterday, today, and forever. He never fluctuates and he never changes. He doesn't go back on his promises and he doesn't change his mind. So it might be true in the Spring to say that "if you don't like the weather, just wait five minutes and it will change", but that will never be true about Jesus. Regardless of the season that we're in and regardless of the circumstances, he will never change. It doesn't matter if it's the most beautiful day of the year or the most miserable; Jesus will be there and he won't be affected by it. Although the circumstances around us may seem unstable, Jesus himself said that there will be wars and rumors of wars, and there will be famines and earthquakes in various places, yet he instructed us not to be afraid because he has overcome the world.

Since St. Patrick's Day just passed while writing this article, I am reminded that we don't always see the end of the matter in the beginning of a difficult trial. Patrick was raised as the son of a Christian official in England who provided him with a rudimentary education and train-

ing. Patrick was kidnapped around the age of 16 when their town was pillaged by raiders and he was taken as a slave from England to Ireland. For six long years he served as a slave in Ireland and worked as a shepherd for his masters. As the story goes, Patrick had an encounter with an angel that told him to return to his home. Patrick returned to England and was reunited with his family where he started studying to become a priest. Before finishing all of his schooling, he had a vivid dream where he had a letter delivered to him from the Irish people asking him to come and share the Gospel with them. Patrick convinced the church that he was called to be a missionary to Ireland, and so he began his long and arduous journey of sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ with his captors. It was difficult and hard, as the Irish people had little if any knowledge of the Christian faith and were bound by idol worship and traditionalism.

Patrick's first Easter seemed to change the fate of the island and its adherence to the Christian faith. Because of its ritualism, there was a religious celebration surrounding one of the false gods of Ireland in the pagan

worship from Fall to Spring, which required that only one fire was to be lit in the land on the hill of Tara. On Easter morning, Patrick lit an unauthorized fire and was brought before the King for questioning. Patrick indicated that he wasn't a threat and he was introducing the light of the world-Jesus Christ-to the Irish people. Patrick lived to share the Gospel with the Irish people, and the rest is history. Patrick's ministry lasted 29 years. He baptized over 120,000 people and established over 300 churches. The weather may change, but Christ never changes, and he is still doing the impossible and the improbable through those who dare to love their captors and share the Good News of Jesus with them

A poem called "The Breastplate" by St. Patrick:

"Christ be within me, Christ behind me, Christ before me, Christ beside me, Christ to win me, Christ to comfort and restore me, Christ beneath me, Christ above me, Christ inquired, Christ in danger, Christ in hearts of all that love me, Christ in mouth of friend and stranger."

FROM THE HOLY CROSS PRESIDENT

What is worship? The well-known theologian, pastor and writer A. W. Tozar describes it as "[to] feel in our hearts and express in our own ways a humbling, delightful sense of admiring awe and astonished wonder and overwhelming love in the presence of that great mystery and unspeakable Majesty, the Ancient of Days." Whew, that's a mouthful! But it's likely what the angels experience every day, maybe every minute. I think it captures a little of what the Psalmist is seeking when encouraging us to "bow down... [and] kneel before the Lord our maker" with a humble heart, in awe and wonder.

We're pursuing a project to upgrade our Sanctuary, our primary space of corporate worship. As communicated in early March, the results of our post-Annual Meeting congregational survey expressed strong support for 3 key components of the proposed project: new lighting for the front, a second screen and new projectors, and a replacement of our aging sound system. There were varying results on other questions as shown in the following chart, though all but two had a majority positive support. There were also many comments, which are still being processed. Thanks to all who participated in the survey and provided their input.

What is our calling, our Mission here at Holy Cross? To help people Know, Live, and Share the Love of Christ! Will this project help us do this? Your Council and ministry leaders believe "yes", with some of the following thoughts:

- Worship fuels our mission. Our outreach, service, and evangelism flow from our time spent glorifying God together.
- A well-equipped sanctuary helps us fulfill our purpose—to declare His greatness and invite others to encounter Him.
- Hospitality extends beyond handshakes; a welcoming space reflects the love of Christ to all who enter.


More to come, we will be back with you regarding revisions to the proposal in the near future.

BE ON THE LOOKOUT



In Matthew 13:44, Jesus recounted a parable about a man who found a treasure in a field that was too

valuable to price. He had two options: steal the treasure or buy the field by selling everything he had. Jesus ends this parable with the purchase of the field because of his obedience. Moses described a similar situation in Deuteronomy 8:11-14. Moses warned the Israelites before entering the Promised Land not to forget God's commandments. Moses knew that when they prospered in the Promised Land, they would store up treasures, forget the Lord brought them out of the wilderness, and trust in themselves.

Our Promised Land and treasure is found in God's Kingdom. In the Lord's Prayer, we pray "Thy Kingdom come," but are we looking for signs? Please allow me to share a recent story of our trip to Indianapolis to cheer on our grandson who was running the mile in a national indoor track meet. Disappointments are oftentimes redirected by God into his appointments.

As he was coming out of the last turn and headed for the finish, he was bumped from behind and fell on the track. He was out of the running for the championship. What a disappointment! Nonetheless, his coaches lodged a protest, and rumors circulated that he might be granted a position to compete in the final. We encountered his coaches the following day while strolling through downtown Indianapolis. They recounted how they had to specify the

exact rule violation to protest. They also had to accompany the protest with \$50 cash which was the exact amount their wallet held. Our grandson went to the finals after the protest was granted.

We know that in God's Kingdom, we will face adversity as well as blessings. Be on the lookout for instances when adversity is turned into a blessing. Our tendency is to react quickly to adversity and not expect blessings to come from them. We should pray with the expectation that adversity will be transformed into a blessing. Consider how Jesus' arrest must have affected the disciples. The darkness persisted until that glorious Easter morning, when the priceless treasure, the "light of the world," was unable to be contained in that tomb.

MY THOUGHTS AFTER MARCH'S RUBY'S PANTRY DISTRIBUTION

I'll be honest—I wasn't looking forward to this month's Ruby's Pantry food distribution. Giving up a morning to stand outside in the cold, losing out on extra sleep—it wasn't exactly appealing. And I know I wasn't alone in feeling that way. **BUT** by the end of the morning, God had renewed my commitment and passion for this hard but important work.

Some of the people who drive through the Ruby's Pantry line are doing okay. They're simply making the most of their finances and have found that Ruby's Pantry is a great way to stretch their budget. Others, however, are in crisis—so much so that they don't even have the \$25 to purchase a share. That's when they receive a Blessings Share, the same amount of food, at no cost.

Certain moments from the March 8, 2025, distribution really stood out to me:

- 1. The tearful gratitude. Some people arrive at the end of the line with tears in their eyes. Life is incredibly hard for them right now, and finances are just one piece of the struggle. They are overwhelmed with thankfulness for such an abundance of food at such a small price.
- The unexpected prayers. When we ask how we can pray for them, there have been some who turn around and ask how they can pray for us and for Holy Cross!
- The deeper struggles. So many people carry burdens far beyond financial hardship. As they pray with our Prayer Warriors, they share heartbreaking challenges—family conflict, relational struggles, addiction, joblessness, serious health concerns, and more areas in need of Jesus' touch.

 The open hearts. Some of the people we meet don't yet know Jesus, but they're willing to listen, to ask questions, and to consider Jesus.

God IS moving powerfully through Ruby's Pantry AND CarePortal. But we are at a critical stage in both of these ministries—past the excitement of something new and into the season that requires endurance, perseverance, and faithfulness.

COUNCIL CORNER: HIGHLIGHTS FROM YOUR EXECUTIVE COUNCIL

Council met on March 18, 2025.

Joining Jesus "Take Ten": Council "took ten" and discussed how they saw God at work in their lives. God blesses us with encouragement through these encounters.

Devotions and Prayer: The 2025 Holy Cross focus is on Discipleship. Pastor Jeff shared the devotion "The Gospel of the Cross" based on Numbers 21:9. Rebellion of the wandering Israelites in the wilderness resulted in the Lord sending poisonous snakes. Through Moses, our compassionate God delivered them from this plague if they only looked at the bronze snake on a pole, created for them. This was a foreshadowing of the Cross of Jesus, for us to look at Christ's sacrifice on the Cross and in faith be delivered. God loves us so (John 3:16). He tells us in Hebrews 12:2 to look to Jesus, the founder and perfector of our faith. There is true deliverance and joy in Jesus.

Report from Pastor Jeff included that the Marriage course is going well; eleven couples are participating. He is grateful for Ken and Lousette Schultz who are serving dinners each Sunday evening for this group study. The Tikkun Purim celebration was well attended. The National Youth Gathering "Endure," in New Orleans, will be worked on to help address the questions chaperoned by Dan Kuball. He will accompany a small group from HC the week of July 18-24.

Finance: Please see Treasurer's report in this newsletter.

Elders: Attendance figures reported for worship services in January: an average of 133 in-person weekly. The online units worshiping via hclc.tv in February averaged 27. Etta Koppenhaver was baptized on Feb. 2, and Pastor Greg Finke (Joining Jesus) gave the Life Lesson on Feb. 23.

Discipleship: Creative Women's Gathering saw 14 ladies from MNATC and 6 from HC; there were good conversations at each table during craft time. Saints Alive held a potluck & games on Mar. 14. Watch for details about a Game Night for ALL (May

Outreach: Ruby's Pantry Distribution for March: 299 shares /230 vehicles. In February, HC members met 14 requests through CarePortal serving 37 children and 18 adults. Currently there are 16 unmet requests.

Trustees: The Trustees will be moving forward with the improvement of the Welcome Center as presented by Outreach and approved by Discipleship and Staff.

Sanctuary Project - Building for Eternity: Cindy shared a document she and Sandy and comments raised by the congregation concerning the Sanctuary project. This document provides background, details

and definitions to communicate reasons for the breakdown/pieces comprising the potential plans. This includes Scripture reference, Lighting, Seating, Screen & Projector, Sound System, Installation -Labor & Integration, Cost Estimates, and tie-in to the Vision at Holy Cross. The council discussed this document at length. This works -in-progress info document will be shared with the congregation and friends of Holy Cross when completed.

RCLS: HC Council shared feedback on the proposed changes to the RCLS Bylaws. Once the RCLS BOD has finalized their Bylaws, they will send out a formal request to each Association Church / Council to present these RCLS Bylaws to their Congregation for approval. The Principal Call Committee will continue to meet and review resumes in hopes of finding another candidate prior to the end of the school year. Final repairs resulting from the January frozen pipe incident will occur over spring break. The board continues to meet with LCEF on potential school building improvements.

The Trustees' Handbook, reviewed biannually, was approved by Council.
